# <u>News from St. Nicolas Church – October 2024</u>

Driving through lanes the smell of apples in the cider orchards hangs heavily. Even the jackdaws are shouting down the chimney, thankfully not falling into the hearth.

Now looking forward to an Autumn of warm colours and the celebrations of harvest. Celebration in all parts of the country despite the vagaries of the weather.

### Reminders

The church porch is open at all times to take shelter, meet for a chat, make hot drink, dip into the Bible and help yourself to any item in the mini foodbank, if you need. There is a larger foodbank at the back of St. Mary's Church in Lenham, open from 10am - 4pm daily. The main church building is open for services, cleaning, meetings etc. please contact the church wardens for a key if you wish to visit at other times. Church Service times are on the notice boards by the porch, the roadside and outside the Village Hall in Grafty Green. Celtic morning prayer is said each Monday morning in St. Nicolas, 9 - 9.30am. This is an informal time with short bible readings and time for discussion and prayer, spoken or in silence. A time to acknowledge the needs of our friends, neighbours, world issues and ourselves. 09.24.03	Co-option of Councillor to Boughton Malherbe Parish Council All councillors were in agreement that Mr Steve Peter will be coopted to the Boughton Malherbe Parish Council. Due to work commitments Mr Peter was unable to attend this meeting but will complete the Declaration of Acceptance at the November meeting.
	<b>Resolved</b> : Formal co-option paperwork will be deferred until the November meeting when Mr Peter can attend.
09.24.04	Public Session/Open Forum A member of the public raised concerns about the PC commenting upon an Ulcombe planning application appeal.
09.24.05	Confirmation of the Minutes of the last Ordinary Parish Council Meeting Councillors were asked if they had any comments regarding the accuracy of the Minutes of the Ordinary Parish meeting that took place on the 1st July 2024. No comments were made. Resolved: The minutes of the Ordinary Parish Council Meeting held on the 1 <sup>st</sup> July were signed by the Chairman as a true record.
09.24.06	<ul> <li>Reports from Borough / County Councillors</li> <li>Cllr Trzebinski gave a short verbal report and reported that the new council have agreed to decarbonise Maidstone House and another building in Maidstone.</li> </ul>

Cllr Pendergrast (KCC Member for Maidstone Rural East) provided the following written report which the chairman read out at the meeting:

August has been a very quiet month at County Hall for Members with no committee meetings The one key area that is being looked into at pace is the impact of the new border controls at Dover – the EU has now announced the autumn start date

On more local issues, although not completely local to Boughton Malherbe, you will be aware of the SEW works commencing shortly on Ulcombe Road, Headcorn. I'm also working with various parishes to address the ongoing speeding issues along the A20 coming east out of Maidstone. Again, although not directly in your parish, this affects all of us to a large degree. This has now got some real momentum with both highways and the police and I'm hoping to see some significant improvements over the coming months.

Finally, I have supported the village hall refurbishment via my share of the KCC Member Grant – the village hall is a vital amenity!

#### 09.24.07 Clerks report and update of resolutions from last meeting

- The clerk confirmed that the Boughton Malherbe Facebook page was now online.
- The recent village litter picking event was successful with a number of residents coming to help.
- Emergency plan A number of volunteers had contacted Cllr Hook directly and Cllr Hook confirmed that she would be emailing the volunteers to suggest a meeting whereby they could get together and discuss further.
- Cllr Hook had also made a contact at Maidstone Borough Council who has offered to come and assist us further with putting together a revised Emergency plan.
- Cllr Hook is hoping to attend a village hall coffee morning to discuss ideas and ascertain with residents whether the Parish council should look to start a group within the village to assist other residents with tasks such as collecting shopping, prescriptions etc. Cllr Hook will report back whether it was felt that residents would like such a service.

#### 09.24.11 Matters concerning the Amesis Agreement

As requested previously, the Clerk had approached Amesis with a revision to their earlier draft agreement however that was rejected on the basis that the time allowed under the contract was sufficient only for the basic service. The wording of the agreement was not discussed however the PC agreed that The Clerk would have authority to agree the work required up to a maximum of 6 hours per month but that any requests for additional time would be referred back to the PC. The siting of the bin was discussed and it was agreed that it would be placed next to the existing public rubbish bin and that additional security in the form of a chain would be added. A budget up to a maximum of £100 was agreed.

a) The PC agreed to find out the cost of purchasing a noticeboard to display the historic map of the village that had been kindly offered.

## Doreen Walter (nee Lewis) 9 Jan 1939 - 10 Sept 2024

This month we say goodbye to a much-loved member of our community.



Doreen was born in Bromley, just 8 months before WWII started and as a toddler moved into Honeywood Road, Lenham. Like a lot of children, Doreen saw her father Charles enlist for our country and barely saw him for 6 years as he fought as a desert rat in Africa. Her twin siblings, Moreen and Robert, were born 2 years later and they were looked after by their mum, Emma.

Doreen attended the primary and secondary schools in Lenham before training as a dressmaker. As a Christian, she was an active member of Lenham Church, from Sunday School and Girl Guides all the way into her

adult life. She found time to support Sid Boreman, the local farmer, feeding his many animals. One of them, Lassie, a retired sheepdog became the first family pet a few years later.

In her late twenties, Doreen became a skilled welder at Marley and that is where she met her husband, Peter. 1969 was the year they were married and made the short 3-mile journey to their family home, Brierley, in Grafty Green with its beautiful views of the countryside. The seventies were a busy time for Doreen and Peter as their 3 children Mandy, Adrian and Louise were born, whilst Brierley was transformed into the bungalow we know today. Peter worked hard to extend the property whilst Doreen used her considerable gardening skills and together, they created a beautiful family home.

However, during the late-eighties and early-nineties Doreen faced considerable challenges as she was diagnosed with breast cancer twice in a 5-year period. She won her battles with cancer and went on to raise money for the Peggy Wood foundation.

Doreen had a love of nature and a strong sense of community spirit. She was an amazing gardener, great cook and very popular in the local farming community. Each year she would work with Ron Maddocks and Mike Davidson to help ensure that the local harvest of strawberries, raspberries, apples, and pears were harvested. In later life she also worked for the Chandlers and Wickens. When Bill and Nelly Blackmore finally moved out of the village in the early eighties, Doreen then managed our village hall for the next 30 years.

Doreen made some amazing friends in the village. The biscuit tin was always well stocked with Jenny (Palmer), Jean (Heywood), Pat (Dodson), Edie (Weller) and many more regularly dropping in for tea or coffee.

The family are humbled by the courage, grace and good humour Doreen showed throughout her illness and her family would like to thank everyone in the local community for their support. Many thanks Mandy, Peter and family

Doreen's funeral will be held at 12.30 on Monday 7 October at Charing Crematorium and afterwards at The Wishful Thinker. If you would like to join family and friends, please contact either Peter or Mandy.





### **Grafty Gourmet**

This is another one of my concoctions that I threw together, so thought it best to type this recipe straight away. It was a bit of a guessing game, so the units of the ingredients are approximate. Taste the sauce as you cook it, and add more of each ingredient if required. It worked really well, and it was extremely tasty with an Indonesian / Malaysian flavour. I used prawns, but you could use pork, chicken, beef or vegetables.

### Prawns in Spicy Peanut Sauce with Fried Rice - Serves 2

2 Hands full of cooked prawns (or2cooked meat or vegetables)11 Large Onion, chopped into ¾ inch2pieces81 Red Pepper, chopped into ¾ inch2pieces2½ Cup of Chicken StockFo1 Small Red Chilli, very finely chopped2(use 1 chilli for slightly spicy or 2 to1put hairs on your chest)(Fe2 Large Cloves of Garlic (crushed)A1 Teaspoon of Chinese Five Spice3Powder56

2 Tablespoons of Tomato Ketchup
1 Cup of Milk
2 ½ Tablespoons of Smooth Peanut
Butter
2 Tablespoons of Lemon or Lime Juice
2 ½ Tablespoons of Soy Sauce
For the Fried Rice:
2 to 3 Tablespoons Oil
1 Cup of Long Grain or Basmati Rice
(Rinsed)
A Hand full of frozen Peas
3 Spring Onions, chopped
Soy Sauce

1. Cook the rice in boiling water as per instructions, but 5 minutes before the end add the peas and stir in. When cooked, drain in a colander and rinse well with cold water.

2. In a saucepan, add the chicken stock, ketchup, soy sauce, lemon juice, milk, peanut butter, chilli garlic and Chinese five spice and simmer, stirring until the peanut butter melts. Keep stirring or the Sauce will stick to the base of the pan and will burn. If the sauce is too runny, make a paste with a little cornflour and water and stir into the sauce to thicken.

3 . Place a little oil in a frying pan, and simmer the onions and pepper until just soft, but still slightly crunchy. When done, add the onions, pepper and prawns (or alternative) to the sauce. Simmer on a low heat, stirring frequently, whilst doing the next step.

4. Add 2 more tablespoons of oil back into the frying pan, and heat. When the oil is hot, add the cold rice and pea mixture, stirring so that the rice is evenly coated in the oil. Fry, stirring for 2 minutes and then add the chopped Spring Onion and a good dash of soy sauce. Stir so that the rice is evenly coated in the soy sauce for another couple of minutes.

5. Serve the rice on a warm plate, and top with the spicy peanut prawn mixture.

# Sue's Nature Notes

**Red Admiral butterfly** This butterfly migrates to the UK and lays eggs mainly on nettle; you might observe leaves knitted together to form a tent with spun silk. The caterpillars feed on the nettle leaves and juicy stems until they pupate in July and August. Two weeks later the butterfly emerges. It is thought that many red admirals hibernate now in the UK. The plants sought for nectar are bramble, buddlia, over-ripe fruit, blackberry,

thistle, and ivy.





# **Christian Message October 2024**

### To give and receive generously

A young woman approached us as we sat eating a picnic lunch next to Thirlmere, in the Lake District, and asked if we could change her £20 note for coins for the car park ticket machine.

Our minds flashed back to a year before, where, at a service station in the Alps, we had found we needed to convert Euros to Swiss Francs before using these to enter the toilets. A kind local man had seen us in a muddle and given us each a Swiss Franc coin - just in the nick of time!

We gave the young woman a £1 coin, despite her protests, and carried on with our lunch, enjoying the lake view and watching people exercise their dogs by the water's edge with sticks and stones to be fetched from the lake. As we set off to leave, the young woman ran up to our car and offered us a large bar of hazelnut chocolate.

'No, really' we protested. 'It was our pleasure to <u>help</u> and a mere pound wouldn't cover the cost of all your lovely chocolate.' The lady wouldn't be swayed, declaring it was all she had with her to offer and that she couldn't bear to think we were out of pocket. Eventually we caved in - it's not every day someone tries to make you eat such a delicious treat - but I rather wished we hadn't. We had just wanted to do a little something kind.

We drove to Keswick where a teenage girl was leaving the ladies' toilet. After her came another and then another, all giggling. 'There's quite a team of you' I teased as a fourth girl appeared round the corner and they giggled some more. Before I knew it one of them ran back to me:

'Would you like me to jump the barrier and push the button so you can get in for free?' She asked. 'No, it's fine' I replied, 'I'll pay to get in.'

'Are you sure? I'll happily do it for you if you like?'

'Thank you, but no, really, I'm fine' I answered as I pushed 50p into the machine, thinking about Keswick District Council and all their overheads, let alone potentially giving a teenager a criminal record!

We then walked to a shoe shop and as we paid for some shoes, it started to pour with rain. The shop assistant rushed behind the scenes and came out with a pretty, <u>brand new</u> umbrella. 'With our compliments' she beamed. How we praised her as we walked back to the car, dry and safe despite the downpour.

The prayer of St Ignatius tells us to give and not to count the cost:

"Teach us, good Lord, to serve you as you deserve;

- to give, and not to count the cost,
- to fight, and not to heed the wounds,
- to toil, and not to seek for rest,
- to labour, and not to ask for reward, except that of knowing that we are doing your will."

Jesus made the ultimate gesture of giving by surrendering his life for us and the Bible tells us to love one another as he has loved us (John 13:34).

The people we met that day on holiday certainly all seemed to like being able to help each other in their own way, whether strictly legally or not! Maybe the challenge is to show generosity appropriately and humbly, avoiding grand gestures, but also to allow others the blessing of giving too, discerning when to accept help graciously and when it is better to gently refuse, for their sake or that of the greater good.


