

We had a fantastic response from the Boughton Malherbe community on the morning of Sunday 11th August as some brave souls ignored the extreme heat to tackle some of the litter hot spots around our area. A litter picking army with fluorescent jackets and litter pickers hit the majority of roads in the Parish. The mission was clearing up and making the area better for wildlife by removing plastics and other materials such as crisp packets and drinks cans. The enthusiasm was infectious, some of us grew quite attached to our litter pickers (they are great as you don't have to bend down or handle litter). One volunteer commented: "I often walk along this path, so it is great to have the right equipment and be able to clear up the long-term litter I see every day".

Thank you to everyone who gave up their morning to spring clean Boughton Malherbe. It's great to be part of a community with such a supportive, can-do mentality. Depending on feedback, we would look to try this approach twice a year, in the Spring and the late Autumn.

Grafty Gourmet

Chicken and mushroom is a timeless flavour combination. On the table in 30 mins, this creamy chicken and mushroom pasta makes a simple, tasty dinner

Creamy Chicken and Mushroom Pasta

Ingredients

4 skinless, boneless chicken thighs
4 tablespoons of olive oil
2 garlic cloves, crushed
200g of mushrooms, sliced
400g of pasta shells
150ml of single cream
Grated zest and juice of ½ lemon
150g of ricotta cheese
2-3 sage sprigs, (leaves picked, half shredded and half left whole)
30g grated parmesan cheese

- 1. Heat the oven to 180°C fan. Put the chicken on a baking tray, drizzle with 2 tablespoons of olive oil and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Roast for 15-20 minutes until cooked through. Set aside to cool slightly, then roughly shred the meat.
- 2. Heat the remaining olive oil in a large pan. Add the garlic and cook for 1 minute, then add the mushrooms and fry, stirring occasionally, for 6-8 minutes until tender and taking on colour. Stir in the chicken and a pinch of salt to season. Set aside.
- 3. Cook the pasta according to the pack instructions. Drain, reserving about 50ml of the pasta water, then toss with a splash of oil to keep the shells separate.
- 4. Pour the cream in a large/wide pan and simmer for 1 minute, then add the lemon zest and juice, ricotta cheese and shredded sage (do not add the whole sage leaves). Stir in the chicken and mushroom mix. Toss the pasta shells with the hot mixture, adding enough reserved pasta water to create a creamy sauce that coats the pasta.
- 5. In a pan. heat a large glug of olive oil over a high heat. Add the whole sage leaves and sizzle for about 45 seconds. Remove and drain on kitchen paper. Sprinkle the leaves over the pasta with the lemon zest and parmesan and plenty of black pepper to serve.

Sue's nature notes

Painted lady butterfly

This butterfly migrates from Africa and has been tracked flying at over 500 metres and can clock up 30 mph; they also migrate south again in the autumn so not over wintering in the UK and they travel in groups!

The plants sought for nectar are thistle, bramble, buddleia, fleabane, marjoram and ragwort, whilst the caterpillars, which can be seen between May to mid-October, feed on vipers bugloss, burdock and thistle.




