News from St. Nicolas Church – November 2024

Harvest celebrations and the scarecrow festival! But no time to take a break, as we are already being given multiple reminders that Christmas is on the horizon! Let alone Craft Fair weekend, Cinderella Panto and other activities and events the village has in store for us through the winter.

Reminders

The church porch is open at all times to take shelter, meet for a chat, make a hot drink, dip into the bible on the windowsill and help yourself to any item in the mini food bank, if you need. There is a larger food bank at the back of St.Mary's church in Lenham, open from 10.00am-4.00pm daily.

The main church building is open for services, cleaning, meetings etc. Please contact the church wardens for a key if you wish to visit at other times.

Church service times are on the notice boards by the porch, the roadside and outside the Village Hall in Grafty Green.

Celtic Morning Prayer is said each Monday morning in the church 9.00am-9.30am. This is an informal time with short bible readings and time for discussion and prayer, spoken or in silence. A time to acknowledge the needs of our friends, neighbours, world issues and ourselves. Any prayer requests left in the porch will be prayed for at this time. This is a gentle, thoughtful way to start the week.

The **Village Coffee Morning** takes place every Tuesday morning, 11.30am -2.00pm in the village hall in Grafty Green. Please keep in mind that this time may shortly change to 12 noon- 2pm. The Post Office is open from 12.45pm-2.15pm.

There are usually Alan's free-range eggs and honey, Sue's handmade cards, Pluckley tea, homemade marmalade, amongst other items for sale. Alan says his hens are slowing down their egg production at the moment, (feeling the cold). All donations for the coffee/teas and cakes are shared equally between St.Nicolas and a charity chosen by popular demand. The next £100 pounds will shortly be given to the aid charities working in the Middle East at this turbulent time.

The Harvest Supper in the Grafty Green village hall took place on 12th October was a very friendly occasion. We were sad that a few people were taken ill shortly before, and we send them our good wishes and hope they have made a speedy recovery. Many thanks to everyone who made the chicken casseroles and delicious apple crumbles. Thank you Janice and John for lots of apples from your garden! Thanks too, to the Craft Club, and others who spent the Friday morning before, designing and producing the amazing harvest flower, fruit and greenery decorations for the hall, with lots of encouragement and ideas from Sandra! <u>See front cover</u>. Approximately £550 were raised for St. Nicolas church funds.

Harvest Festival service was in the church on Sunday 13th October at 6.30pm. The church looked lovely with all the flowers etc. from the hall, thanks to those who moved them, Kenneth and the Goodwin family. The perishable food gifts were auctioned by Kenneth and raised approximately £120 which has been given to Demelza House, the children's hospice. The non-perishable gifts have been delivered to the local food banks.

Platts Heath school held their harvest service in St. Nicolas on Friday 11th October. We appreciated the children's artwork and gifts. The drawings etc. have been left around the church for all to admire. The gifts of produce that the children brought have also been delivered to the food banks. Thank you everyone.



A very simple soup recipe to warm you up on these cold nights. The balance of the carrot and parsnip give a sweet and savoury flavour.

CARROT & PARSNIP SOUP

Ingredients 1 tablespoon of olive oil 1 onion, roughly chopped sea salt, to season $\frac{4}{2}$ teaspoons of dried chilli flakes 250g/9oz of carrots, peeled and roughly chopped 250g/9oz of parsnips, peeled and roughly chopped 1.2 litres/2 pints of vegetable stock freshly ground black pepper $\frac{4}{2}$ teaspoons of apple cider vinegar (optional)

Method

1. Heat the oil in a large, lidded saucepan over a medium-high heat. Gently fry the onion with a pinch of salt until soft and lightly golden (this should take 8–10 minutes). Add the chilli flakes and fry for a further minute.

2. Add the carrots, parsnips, stock and a generous grinding of black pepper. Bring the pan to the boil, then reduce to a simmer and cook with the lid on for 20–25 minutes until the parsnips and carrots are tender.

3. Blend the soup using a stick blender. Season to taste with more salt and pepper and add a little apple cider vinegar if the soup is lacking brightness and vibrancy.

Gardening tips for November

- 1. Rake up leaves from the lawn, shred them for the compost or leaf mould bins, otherwise the garden bin.
- 2. Plant bulbs for spring colour daffodils, tulips, hyacinths, crocus etc.
- 3. Prune roses by a third to an outward facing bud to prevent root rock by winter winds. Further pruning to shape plants takes place in the spring.
- 4. Wash empty pots and trays ready for spring sowing.
- 5. Sow sweet pea seeds indoors to get a head start
- 6. Look out seed catalogues and plan for next year's planting / sowing a nice dry job to do indoors with a hot cuppa and a biscuit!

Sue's Nature Notes

Comma butterfly

To identify this butterfly the wings are orange and scalloped with a little white comma at the bottom edge.

They like to feed on buddlia, thistles, brambles, blackthorn, knapweed privet and ivy as well as rotting fruit. Their caterpillars like nettles, hops, elm, gooseberry, and willow, preferably in a sunny sheltered spot. Cutting back nettles to produce fresh growth for egg laying.

You may see the caterpillars from April through to September as there can be two broods a year. They overwinter in woodpiles, hollow trees etc.







Christian Message

November

From Rev. Richard Birch

Autumn is a time of great changes, as the weather becomes colder and wetter towards winter. From our windows we can see the houses across the railway line; all summer they have been hidden by the trees, but now as the leaves fall, we can see them clearly. We wear different clothes for warmth and protection from wind and rain. The seasons change every year and we expect it, but the way that change happens is changing, Spring comes a couple of weeks earlier, summers are hotter, storms are more violent.

During November we have the sombreness of Remembrance Day, however, as the evenings draw in and the temperature falls, we also seem to need celebrations. These too can change over the years. Once upon a time All Saints Day, 1st November, was one of the biggest celebrations for the Church, but it has lost its importance now. More recently Guy Fawkes, 5th November, has been the great autumn event for many, but this now seems to be eclipsed by Halloween, 31st October. Halloween is the old name for the Eve of All Hallows, or All Saints. Whichever celebration you choose the Christian church throughout the world will remember All Saints Day and celebrate all the good people who have gone before us.

We live in a time when nothing seems constant, change is all around us, some of it good, some not so good, some we can effect, much of it is out of our control. I find it helpful to remember the one thing that remains constant, our loving creator God. When Moses gave the Law to the people of God it was summarised as "love God with all your being and love your neighbour as yourself". Jesus repeated this as essential for a full life. God wishes to have a relationship with each and every one of us, based on love.
