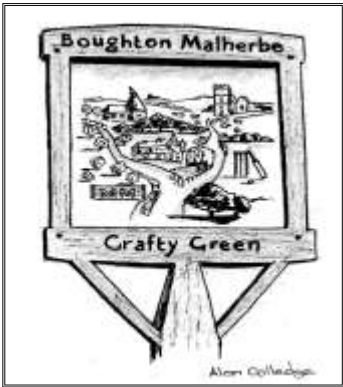

Shellina Prendergast - Your new Kent County Councillor (and Maidstone Borough Councillor)

I am delighted to have been elected to represent Maidstone Rural East, which includes Boughton Malherbe and Grafty Green, at the Kent County Council election on 4th May.

For Kent as a whole, the Conservatives gained 67 of the 81 seats. Labour won 5 seats whilst losing all their sitting councillors. The Liberal Democrats won 14% of the vote and kept the same number of councillors (7) and have now become the official opposition party replacing UKIP who lost all the 16 seats they won 4 years ago.

Alongside my commitment to ensure that all residents of Maidstone Rural East are represented at County Hall, I am very pleased to report that I have taken up the position of Deputy Cabinet Member for Children, Young People and Education - particularly as this has coincided with the recent OFSTED assessment of KCC's Children's Services as being "Good". OFSTED identified only one area where there was further improvement needed but the overall report is glowing and available in full on the KCC website. Considering the strains put on our services by the influx of Unaccompanied Asylum Seeking Children, and the additional burden on public services of the large number of children placed in foster care in Kent by other local authorities, this is a result that is really welcome by all. KCC has made protection and care of the vulnerable our top priority and extra funding has been diverted here whenever needed – whilst still facing significant financial pressure and the wish to do more in other areas such as improving our roads.

On a different, but related matter, do you know someone aged between 11-18 (or 25 if they have special needs) who has been "trying their best"? If so, please nominate them for one of KCC's Tryangle awards which recognise young people for a whole range of activities from being a good friend or carer, achievement in arts, sports, personal development, courage or community action. There's information about the wide ranging categories on the KCC website and nominations close on 12th July 2017.

Finally, whilst I will do my very best to communicate with you on a regular basis and attend as many parish council meetings as possible, I am always happy for you to contact me with any queries -contact details below:

Grafty Gourmet

Brown sugar on pork give these luscious skewers their tasty crunch. The fish sauce, now more widely available in shops, is definitely essential to achieve that Vietnamese flavour. The marinade should be enough for up to four steaks.

Vietnamese BBQ Pork

Serves 2

2 pork loin steaks
2 shallots roughly chopped
3 tea spoons of dark brown sugar
Half tea spoon of dried chilli flakes
2 table spoons of fish sauce
2 table spoons of vegetable oil

1. Put the shallots, brown sugar, chilli flakes and fish sauce in a food processor and blend until it makes a paste. Stir in the oil.
2. Cut pork loin steaks across the grain into 7 cm long strips about 2.5 cm wide.
3. Mix pork pieces and the paste in a bowl with your hands, rubbing in the marinade. Cover and refrigerate for between 4 to 24 hours.
4. Thread the pork on skewers and barbecue until cooked, rotating skewers for approximately 5-10 minutes or until cooked through. These can alternatively be grilled in the same way.
5. Serve in a baguette with pickled veg for a Vietnamese sandwiches or on top of rice noodles and mixed salad.

5 Personal Cyber Security Tips for 2017

While there are no guarantees that malicious actors won't get to your information, the following tips will decrease the probability of getting your personal information hacked.

1. Have Complicated, Unique, Difficult-To-Crack Passwords

Hate changing your passwords for your social media and online banking, so do I, but having someone invade your privacy, social channels, or even financials is a lot worse. There are some on-line tools that can be used to automatically generate passwords, so feel free to research these eg: 1Password and LastPass.

2. Update Your Passwords Regularly

Change your passwords periodically (at least every 6-12 months). While having a really difficult password is the number one way to protect your accounts, changing your password cannot hurt.

3. Tighten Your Security and Privacy Settings

Facebook, LinkedIn and other social media channels occasionally change their privacy options, which is easy to miss (or dismiss) as those changes are generally not very interesting. For a safe 2017, visit your social channels and review your privacy and notification settings.

4. Always Install Updates

Ensure you install updates to your applications, Operation System (OS) or website within one week of receiving them. Some of these updates are specifically designed to plug security holes in the software. Be aware that MS Windows 7 (or earlier) is no longer supported by Microsoft, so there are no updates for these versions. It is advisable to update your Windows versions if possible.

5. Don't Simply Click On Any Link

Phishing is generally an attempt to get users to click on a malicious URL that will upload a virus. Never click on a URL sent by your bank, PayPal or other account that requires you to sign in. Instead, go to the site directly and log in from there to check messages.

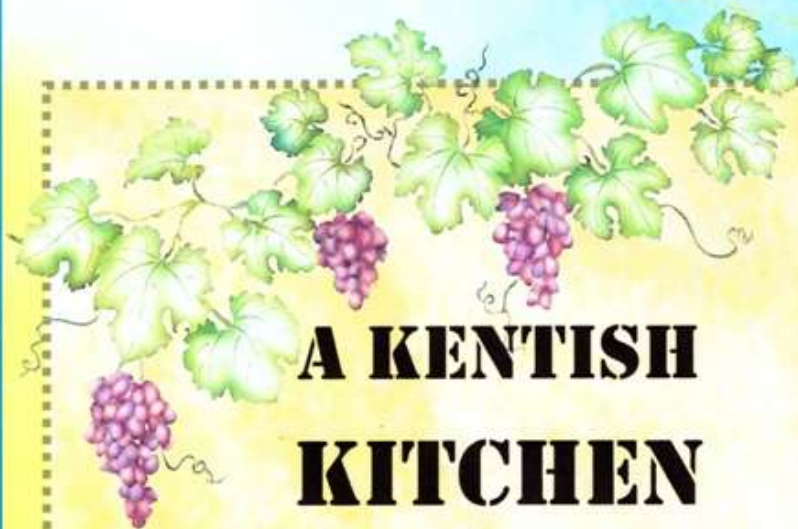

Christian Message July 2017

One of the saddest things that we ever have to do is to say 'goodbye'. We can all probably think of a time when that has been extremely difficult.

Some of you will know that two of my children live quite near, but I don't see my youngest son as often and it is difficult to say goodbye to him when I do get to see him.

A child in one of our church schools recently told me how sad it was to say goodbye to a baby her family had been fostering.

And, of course, 8 months ago we said goodbye to our last Priest in charge here in LV. And now our newly appointed priest is preparing to say goodbye to the parishes he has been serving in. He told me that this is an emotional time for him, even though he is very much looking forward to coming to Len Valley. I have told him that our prayers are with him.

When we say 'goodbye' we are saying 'God be with you'. and in our English language 'goodbye' can be quite final. Unlike Italian for instance where 'Ciao' or 'arrivederci' means, I think, 'see you again'. As does the German 'auf wiedersehen'. And then the French 'au revoir' meaning 'until we see each other again'. all these interpretations are NOT so final.

We might just say 'see ya'! But, as I said, 'goodbye' can be quite final...

And so we can relate to how the disciples of Jesus might have felt when Jesus died, how sad they would have been, but how happy they would have felt when they realised he was alive again! But then, just 40 days after the resurrection, when Jesus was with his disciples on a hilltop, he told them that he must go back to his Father in heaven. We can only imagine how his friends felt then, how all sorts of thoughts must have gone through their minds. About how they would be left alone again.

How were they going to carry on the work of spreading this Good News without Jesus there to guide them?

I guess we too might have felt something like that when our last Priest in charge announced his retirement. For myself, I was aware that God spoke to me. First, in my heart, saying 'you do this in *my* strength'. God sent his Holy Spirit to help me with the situation, just as he sends him to each one of us, **if we ask**, in whatever situation we find ourselves .

For Jesus' disciples, then, and for us now, there is the promise that God will send 'the Spirit of truth' to be with us, and to teach and guide us, if we ask. 'I will not leave you orphaned' Jesus says. That was his promise before his Ascension into heaven, and before the Day of Pentecost when The Holy Spirit showed himself in the power of

wind and fire. And so, the departure of the physical Jesus from this world is a plus for us - not a minus. We have the gift of the Holy Spirit always with us, wherever we are and whatever our situation. We are never alone because we are not left as orphans and we can all be welcomed into that eternal family relationship that exists with the Trinity of God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit

We no longer see Jesus on earth but we have not been left orphans - we are not children left without a loving parent.

Absolutely Not!!

Holy Spirit of God, we thank you for Your presence always with us. Be our teacher, we pray. Teach us to learn from you and help us to trust you to lead us where you would have us go. Amen
